AN AUSPICIOUS BEGINNING

When people ask how the first year of the Goodman Nonprofit Center has gone, I tell them it's been a whirlwind. A center dedicated to supporting our nonprofit community had been years in the making – yet MCF launched it just as a rush of federal policy changes sent shock waves through Madison-area organizations. In that moment, the need for a trusted hub for information, professional development and peer support could not have been clearer.



In our inaugural year, we built a strong financial foundation, convened an experienced Advisors' Council, mapped a clear program strategy and launched our flagship initiative: the Goodman Nonprofit Fellowship.

Our first cohort of 18 executive directors meets monthly with expert instructors, building skills in governance, financial leadership, storytelling, fundraising and more – while forming a trusted peer network that understands the complexities of mission-driven leadership.

In 2026, we're expanding our offerings to include a blog, webinars and workshops on subjects like data collection and advocacy, and new resources for our website.

We're deeply grateful to our Founding Partners (page 4) and donors who believed in this vision and helped bring it to life. Your support is essential to strengthening the nonprofit community in Greater Madison.

And finally, I want to thank my colleagues at MCF – those who raised the endowment, set up the systems, pay the bills, and surround Jazzmine and me with expert guidance and advice.

GOODMAN NONPROFIT FELLOWSHIP

The Goodman Nonprofit Center launched its first major program, the Goodman Nonprofit Fellowship, in September 2025. The Fellowship's launch marked a significant milestone in the Center's inaugural year. Designed for current executive directors of nonprofit organizations, the Fellowship responds to a clear and pressing need for sustained, high-quality, affordable leadership development that is practical and grounded in the real challenges of running mission-driven organizations.

An Intentional Learning Community

The inaugural cohort brought together 18 nonprofit leaders from across the Madison area, representing a remarkable diversity of missions and communities served. Each arrived with both significant talent and experience and a shared willingness to grow.

The Fellowship was intentionally designed as a learning community rather than simply a series of classes. Fellows meet monthly, engaging deeply with one another and with expert instructors and facilitators, discussing the complex realities of nonprofit leadership.

Each Fellowship session focuses on a core dimension of nonprofit leadership and organizational effectiveness. Throughout these sessions, the Fellowship has been enriched by the generosity of
